APPLICATION FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF JEWISH STUDIES STUDENT AWARDS

To be eligible for an award or scholarship, the student must be a sophomore, junior, or senior with a declared major or minor in Jewish Studies. Preference is given to students who have a sustained record of achievement in Jewish Studies. Students **must apply** to be considered for these awards, all of which are based on academic merit. Prior recipients may reapply. Some awards are based on both academic merit and financial need; to be considered for the latter awards, students must have a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) on file with the Rutgers Financial Aid Office. Graduate students doing research on a Jewish Studies topic are also eligible for consideration.

- 6. List any renewable scholarships that you have received from the State of New Jersey, Rutgers University or other sources. Please also indicate any financial aid award, such as Pell, TAG, or EOF, which you received in 2008-2009.
