# JEWISH STUDIES - STUDY ABROAD AWARDS

Eligibility and Requirements: To be eligible for an award to take Jewish Studies courses or to pursue research related to Jewish Studies abroad, the student must be a sophomore, junior, or senior with a declared major or minor in Jewish Studies at Rutgers. Graduate students enrolled at Rutgers doing research on a topic in Jewish Studies are also eligible for consideration. Preference is given to students who have a sustained record of achievement in Jewish Studies. It is advisable that undergraduate students seeking to transfer credits from institutions abroad confirm their coursework prior to leaving the country.

To be considered for an award, students must submit this application to the Department of Jewish Studies, along with a copy of their unofficial transcript by **noon on Friday, November 12, 2010.** Students must also request two letters of recommendation from faculty, one of whom is a member of the Department of Jewish Studies, which should also be submitted by that date. (Please request these letters from faculty at least two weeks before the deadline.) Prior recipients of awards may re-apply and must submit a new application form and request new letters of recommendation.

All awards are based on academic merit; some awards are based on both academic merit and financial need. To be considered for awards based on both merit and need, students must have a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) on file with the Rutgers Financial Aid Office. If you receive needs-based financial aid, please be advised that receiving a Jewish Studies Student Award may result in the reduction of federal student aid or loans.
