NEW BRUNSWICK/PISCATAWAY, N.J. – New Jersey middle and high school teachers are invited to apply to the Master Teacher Institute (MTI) in Holocaust Education, which is based on Rutgers' New Brunswick campus. New courses begin in September 2011.
