Who's Passing for Whom? African Americans, Jews, and the Shifting Color Line

This faculty seminar will explore historical Black-Jewish alliances and fractures, with a focus on the phenomenon of white Jewish Americans assuming a Black identity. We will examine recent examples of racial passing, such as the case of Jessica Krug, a professor at George Washington University. In 2020, it was revealed that she was not "Jess La Bombalera," a Nuyorican woman, but a Jewish woman from outside Kansas City. This seminar will analyze the ways such crossings misconstrue Blackness and suggest explanations for why such crossings remain a pervasive problem of the 21st century.
